Bioaerosols	All Participants and staff	Airborne micro-organisms including spores, bacteria and fungi (e.g. Aspergillus fumigatus) that are naturally present in decomposing material. Gardeners are most likely to breathe these in when turning compost, especially in warm weather. People with an existing chest conditions such as asthma or bronchitis or those prone to allergies are most at risk. • Do not open bags of compost or potting media with your head right over it. • Avoid potting-up in confined spaces. • Moisten dry potting media before use. • Dampen down dry compost heaps before turning or use. Tetanus	All Participants and staff	 Tetanus bacterium can enter through cuts or wounds. Since gardeners regularly handle thorny plants, soil or manure, they are at a higher risk of being infected than non-gardeners. Wear gloves whenever handling soil, compost. Cover all open wounds. Ensure tetanus jabs are up to date (all children should have had 4 doses by the age of 4 through the NHS childhood vaccination programme with a final dose at 14). Otherwise, see your local GP for a tetanus vaccination if you have cut yourself on a plant or get soil or manure in an open wound. 	No further action at this time
Sepsis	All Participants and staff	 Although rare, sepsis can be triggered by an infection in any part of the body, following an injury in the garden such as a cut. All cuts should be cleaned out and covered with an appropriate dressing as soon as possible. Wear protective gloves when handling plants with thorns. 	No further action at this time
Weil's disease (Leptospirosis)	All Participants and staff	This is a disease humans can catch from rats through water or wet vegetation contaminated with rat urine. Rats also transmit salmonella. All compost created from raw food scraps is kept off the ground in plastic or metal containers. • Wear gloves whenever handling soil, compost. • Always wash hands before eating or drinking. • Staff and participants are advised to wash all vegetables that are in contact with soil before eating.	No further action at this time



Plant hazards	All Participants and staff	 Any poisonous or plants that can cause irritant will be pointed out by staff. All plants can have saps, hairs or pollens that may cause irritation in some people. The use of gloves when handling any fully grown plant is recommended. Thin latex or latex-free gloves can be provided/worn for handling seedlings if required. 	No further action at this time
Natural fertilisers – Comfrey feed	All Participants and staff	 These are to be stored on shelving out of read of small children. They should be labelled with easy to read labels. Gloves should be worn when handling. Briefing and appropriate supervision will be given to all children. 	No further action at this time

Hands must be washed No sucking fingers – children's guardians to supervise and maintain good hand hygiene if child is a thumb or finger sucker Gates to allotment will be closed. All Activities	All Participants and staff	 All activities are dynamically risk assessed. Activities may be changed from the timetable or stopped, if on the day or at any point, the activity is not deemed appropriate to the ability or behaviour of the group or weather conditions. A briefing on all activities and the safety precautions that should be taken will be given by an experienced member of Dukes Barn Staff. It is the accompanying school staffs responsibility to know the abilities of their group and advise the instructor accordingly. 	No further action at this time

Car Park Areas & the Dukes Barn premises	All Participants and staff	 Everyone is given a health and safety introduction on arrival as to the rules of the Dukes Barn Activity Centre and associated daily hazards in order to keep everyone safe. All people entering the property of Dukes Barn are made aware via signs to restrict speed etc All children should be supervised when entering Dukes Barn or crossing carpark areas. 	No further action at this time	
Out of Bounds Areas	All Participants and staff	 Everyone will be briefed by Dukes Barn members of staff as to where they can access. A guided walk around the areas will be undertaken so everyone is aware of where they can or can't go. 	No further action at this time	



M.U.G.A (multi-use games area)	All Participants and staff	 The surface can be slippery when wet, participants advised to wear appropriate footwear. Netting, goals, hoops and fencing are not to be climbed as this will create an entrapment and fall risk. No equipment is to be moved unless specifically instructed to by a trained member of staff. 	No further action at this time	
Outdoor classroom/poly tunnel	All Participants and staff	 Children should be appropriately supervised when in these structures. All items and equipment should be put away properly so as not to pose a fall or trip hazard. When removing items from shelving consider height, risks and appropriateness of task. Rough wooden surfaces and pillars within the outdoor classroom – care must be taken when using the space. Areas will have adequate ventilation – in hot weather the use of the polytunnel will be carefully considered. 	No further action at this time	
Sensory garden	All Participants and staff	 Participants will be advised on what fruit/vegetables/plants/herbs can and can't be consumed in harvesting activities. This area has uneven and narrow pathways that may not be suitable for all abilities. 	No further action at this time	
Orchard	All Participants and staff	 Unless part of a planned activity the compost areas are out of bounds. The tepee should be left open at all times to allow for ventilation and safeguarding. There are areas of scrub and ancient stone walls around the boundary. Participants will be briefed not to climb or sit on these. Gates – care should be taken when opening and closing so as to avoid entrapment of fingers. These should not be climbed. Participants will be advised on what fruit can and can't be consumed in harvesting activities. 	No further action at this time

Picnic area containing tunnel, willow structure, fire pit and wood store	All Participants and staff	 Picnic benches are not to be moved or used in an inappropriate way that may cause injury. The fire pit contains low level bench seating. The use of the fire pit is risk assessed separately. The wood store area is stacked appropriately. Lifting and carrying of wood will be briefed as part of the activity briefing. The walkway to the seating area above the tunnel can be slippery when wet and has chicken wire over the surface in places to reduce this risk. Care should be taken on the steep grass banks surrounding this area especially at the tunnel entrances. The tunnel is unlit and is out of bounds unless part of a supervised activity. The height of the tunnel is restricted with bends and some sharp gradient changes. Willow structure should not be climbed under any circumstances. By its nature there could be sharp twigs protruding at certain times of the year. Careful management of the structure will minimise but not eliminate the risk. There areas of scrub and ancient stone walls around the boundary. Participants will be briefed not to climb or sit on these. 	No further action at this time	
Hazel grove area	All Participants and staff	 This area has some low branches and care should be taken when moving through it. Gates – care should be taken when opening and closing so as to avoid entrapment of fingers. These should not be climbed. There are areas of scrub and ancient stone walls around the boundary. Participants will be briefed not to climb or sit on these. 	No further action at this time	
Court-yard	All Participants and staff	 The stone surface in this area can be slippery when wet. Picnic benches are not to be moved or used in an inappropriate way that may cause injury.
